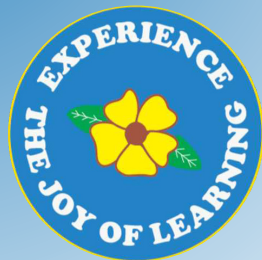

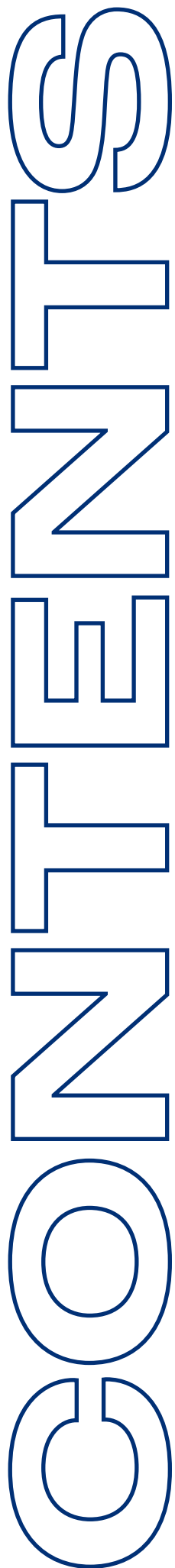

## **Our Motto:**

The place where I can be 'me'.

## **Mission:**

The aim of our school is to help a child realize his unique potential in the light of Sri Aurobindo's vision of integral education. His philosophy of education aims at the flowering of the child's physical, emotional, mental, and spiritual personality. The cultivation of Beauty, Power, Knowledge, and Love is what he calls Integral Education.

## **Integral Education Ideals:**

Our school is guided by Sri Aurobindo's three principles of teaching.

1. The first principle of true teaching is that nothing can be taught. But everything can be learned! This principle shifts the focus from the teacher to the student and from 'how to teach' to 'how best can the student learn.'
2. The second principle is that the mind has to be consulted in its own growth. We focus from 'we-know-what's-good-for-you syllabus' to making the student participate in a flexible delivery and learning process. The teacher is more of a facilitator or a guide here.
3. The third principle of education is to work from the near to the far, from that which is to that which shall be - The first step in learning is to establish a context that is familiar and relevant to the student from his own point of view. This ensures that the resistance is low and motivation is high. The mind is inspired to take the journey now!

We at Primrose work for a global movement towards Integral Education that strives for the development of all aspects of a child's personality.

Physical education and team sports sessions provide a strong and healthy graceful body, the first requirement in a child's education.

Children also involved in music, arts, drama, craft, skating, and yoga so that they are channelized through freedom, leadership, responsibility, and learning by doing acquiring vital education.

Mental Education is developed through subjects like languages, Mathematics, Sciences, and Social Sciences.

Spiritual Education is given more importance to the growth of the spirit than intellectual, inculcating values like love, truth, faith in the heart.

We give international education fostering universal love, sympathy, fellow feeling and understanding, accepting kids from all over the country and the world living together in peace and harmony, above all creeds, all politics and all nationalities.

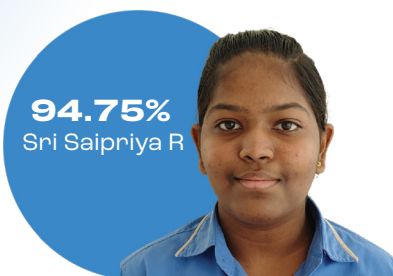
## CONGRATULATIONS!!!!

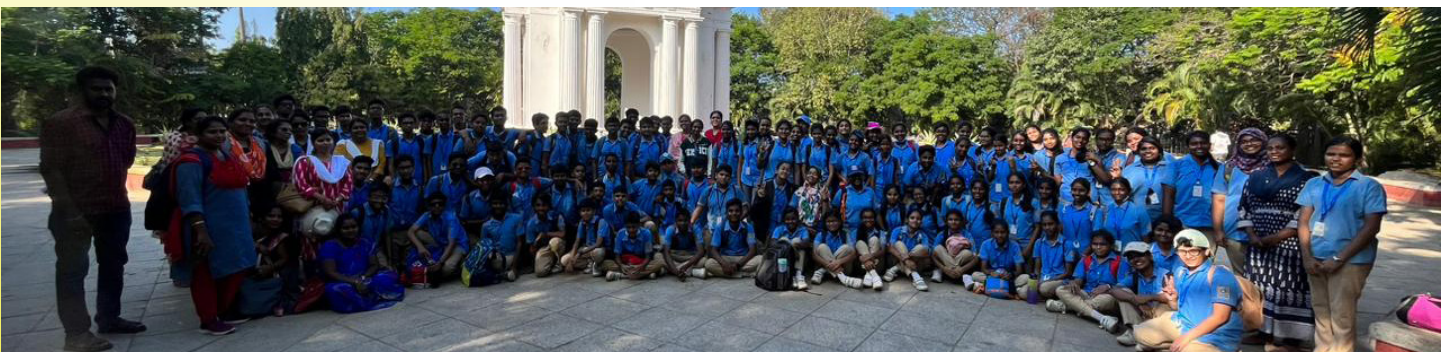


# Field Trips

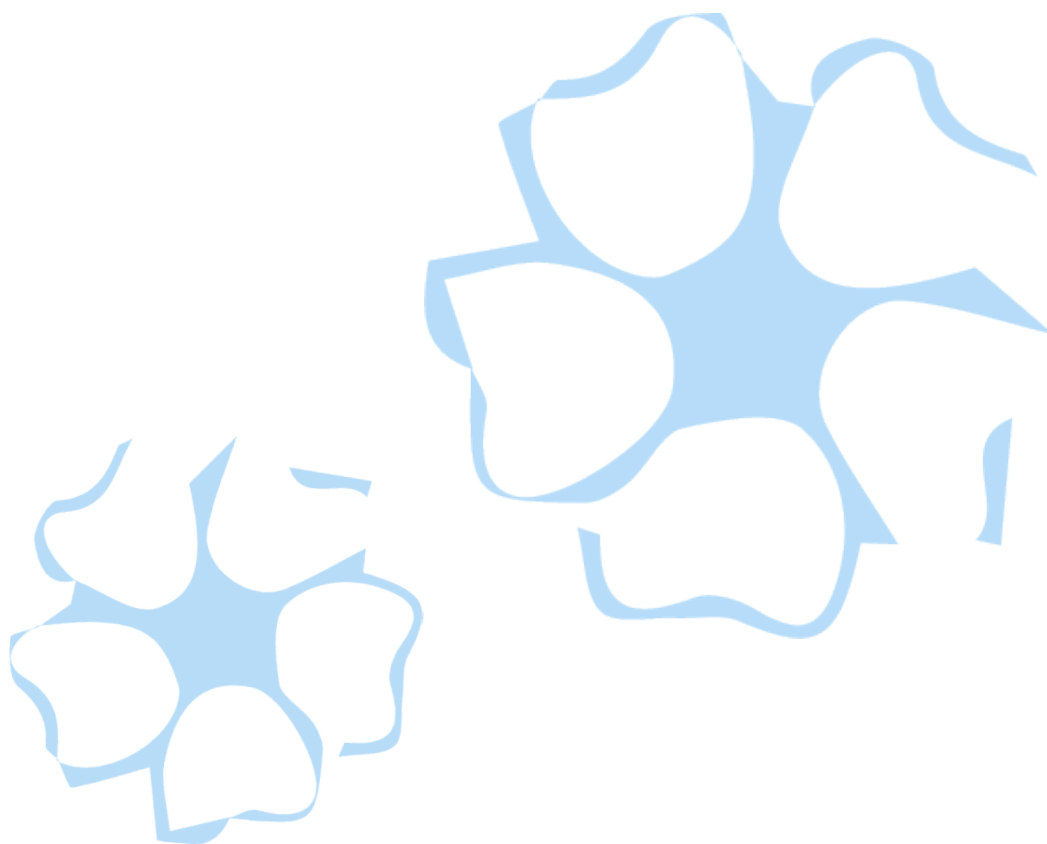
