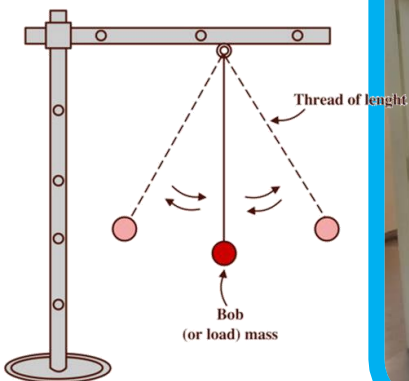
# MUN AWARDS

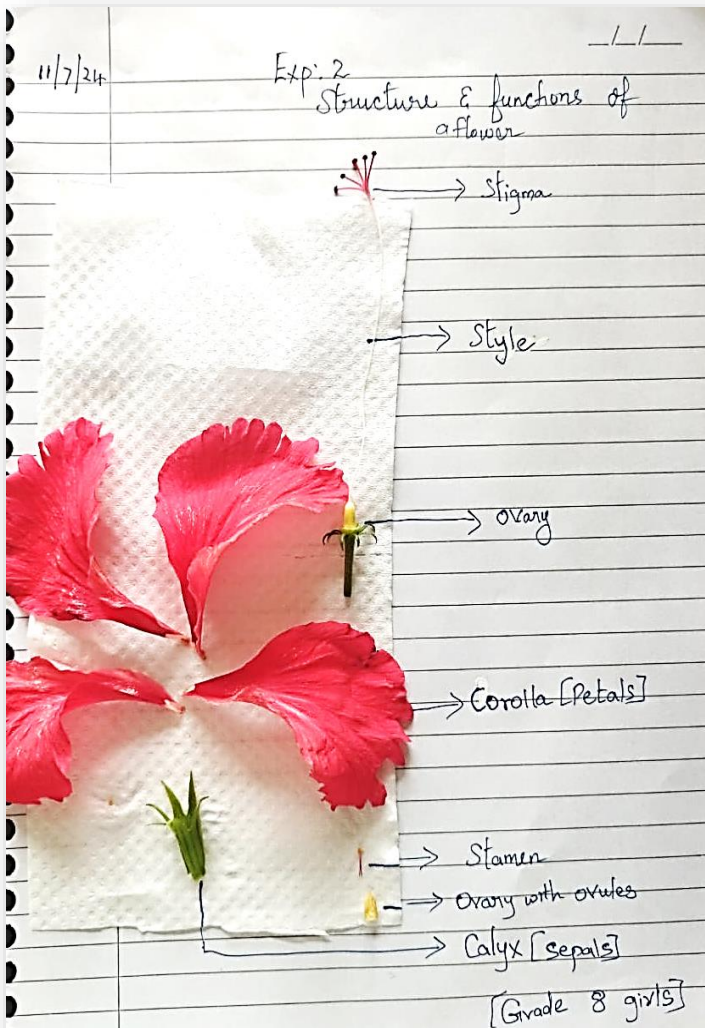




# BIOLOGY LAB – VIII GIRLS



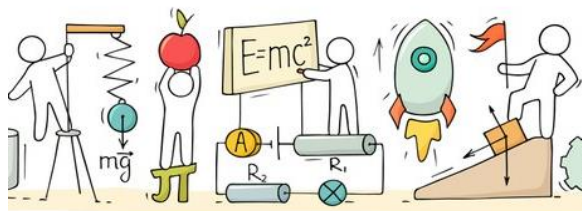

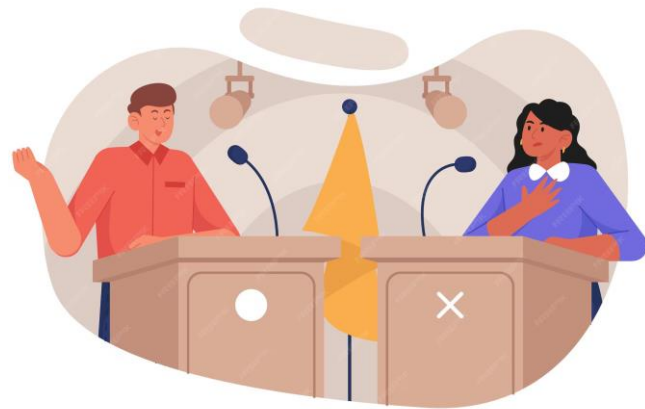


## DEBATE

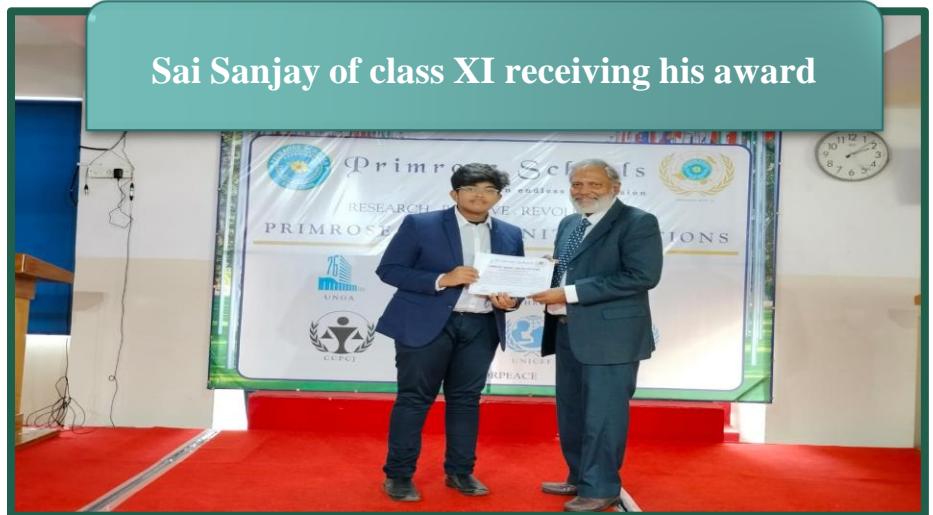
