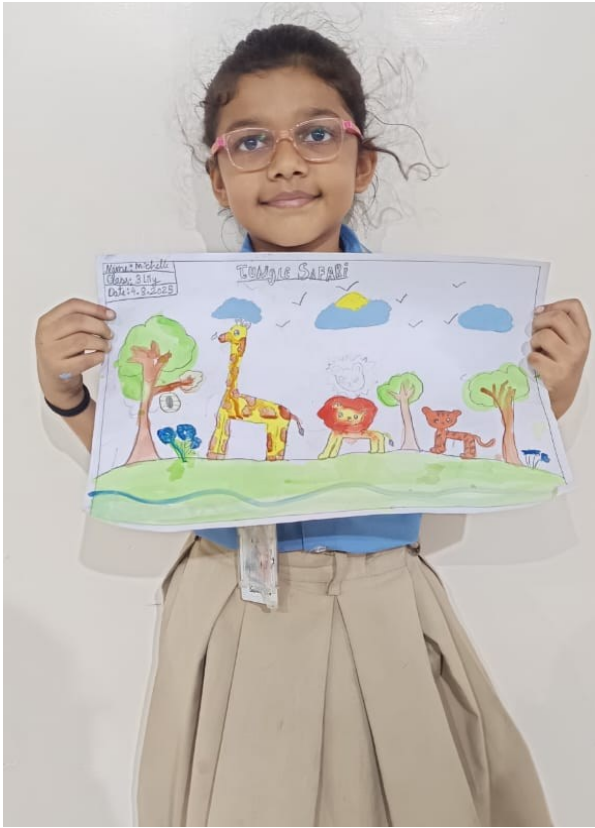
The students of class III Lily led a soulful morning assembly centered on the value of dreams and determination.

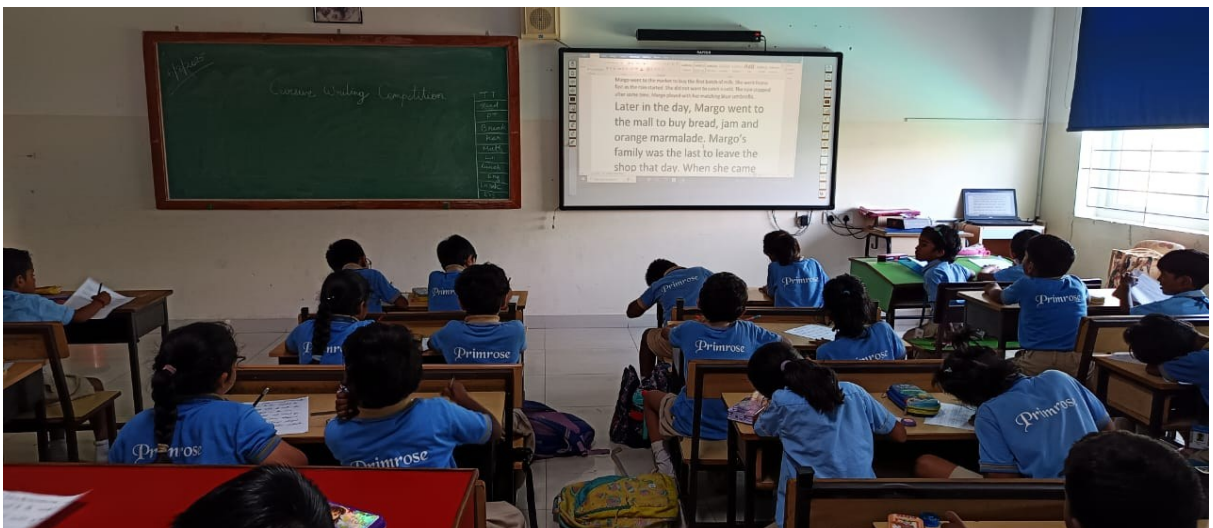
JEWELLERY MAKING

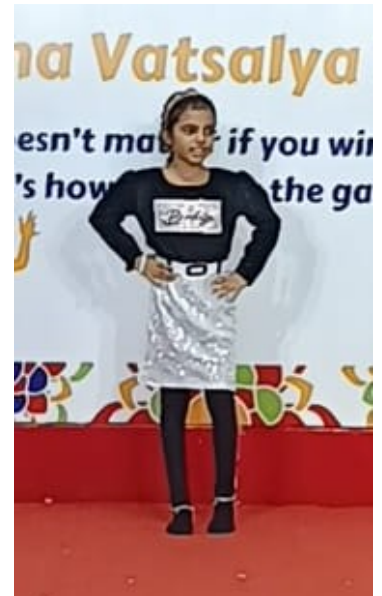

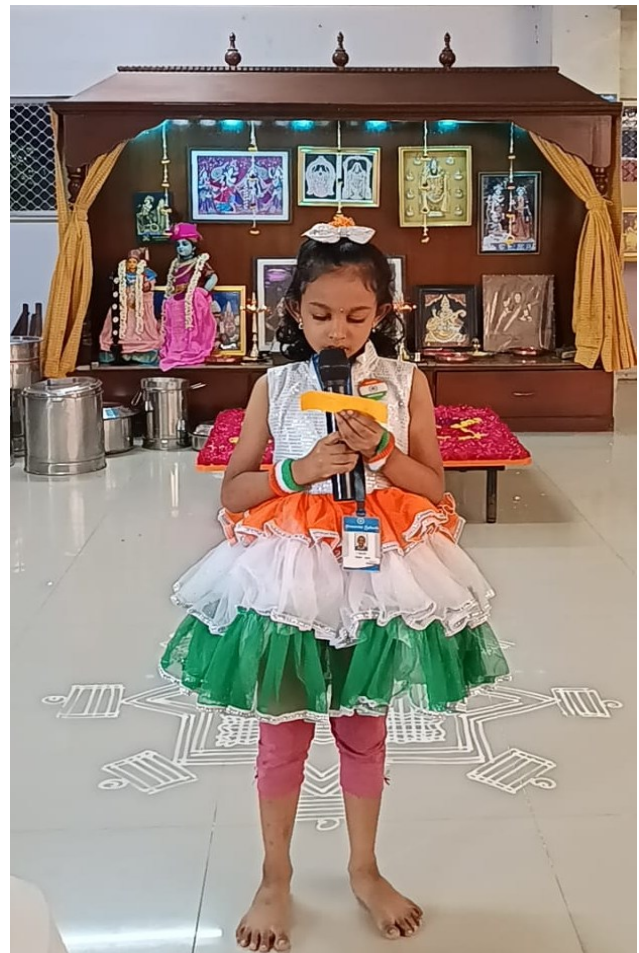

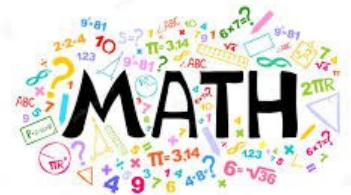
INDEPENDENCE DAY CELEBRATION- STUDENTS DANCE

CLASS II LILY MATH ACTIVITY- MEASUREMENTS



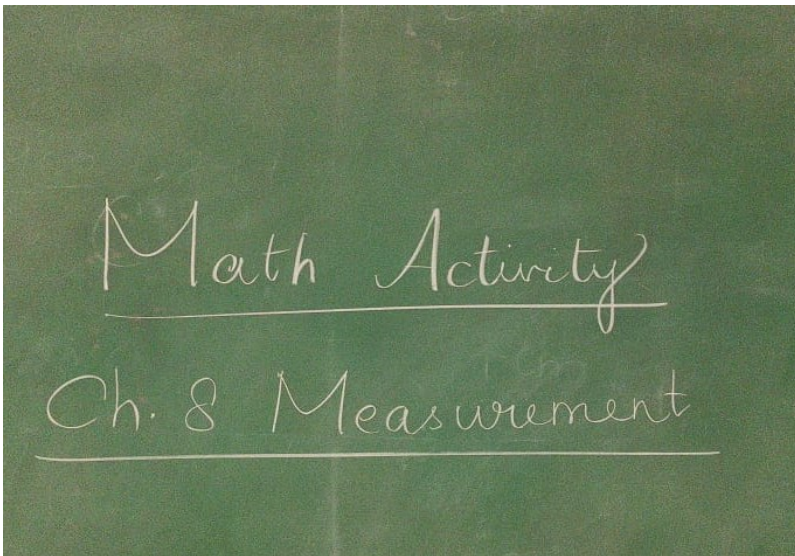

INDEPENDENCE DAY CELEBRATIONS (15.08.2025)



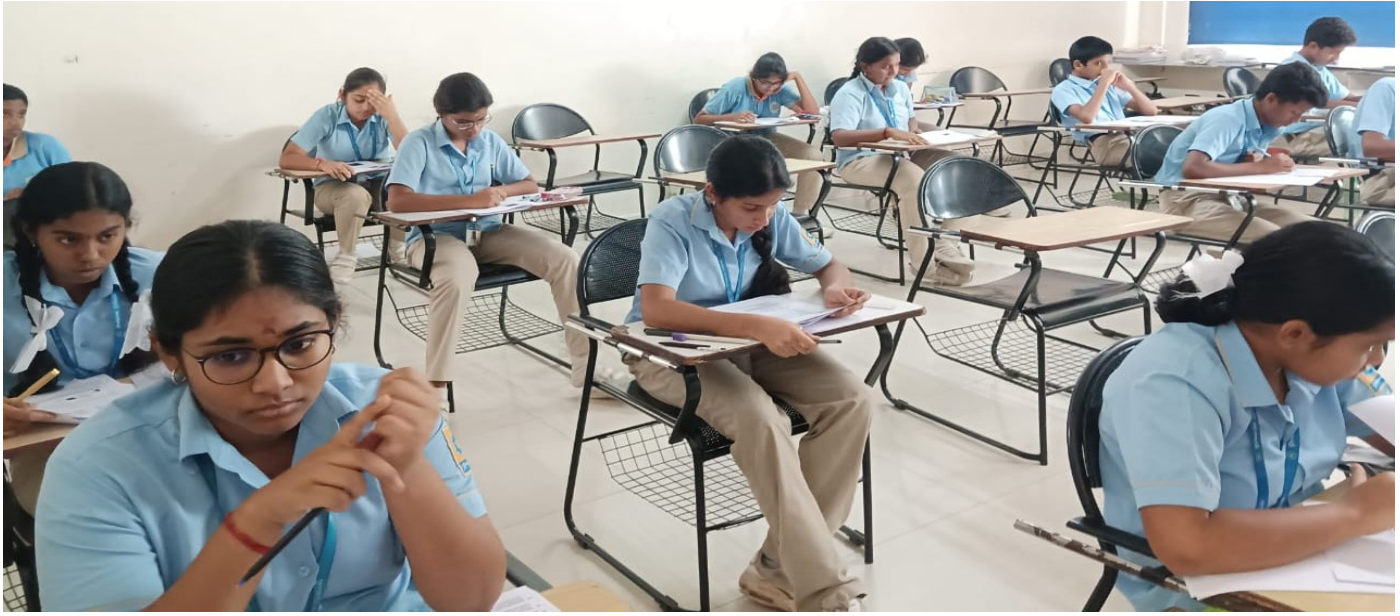

The **SA1** exams for **Class 9** have commenced. We wish all our students' success and encourage them to stay focused, manage their time well, and approach each exam with confidence.

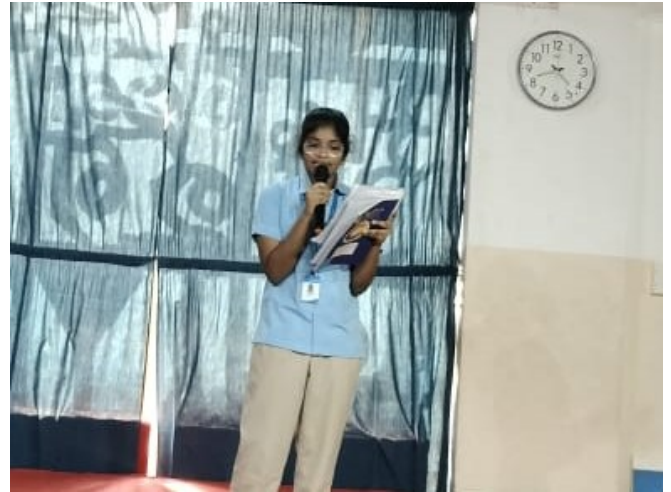

Our very own Primrose karate team performed exceptionally well, with several students earning top honors in their categories.

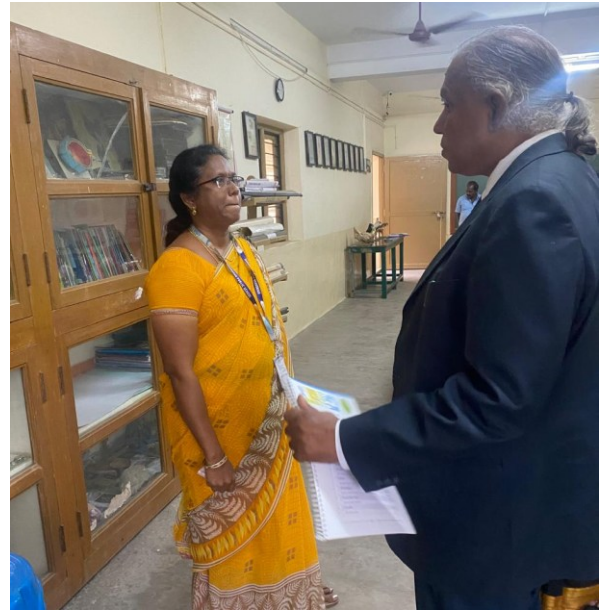

SA-1 EXAM CLASS 10

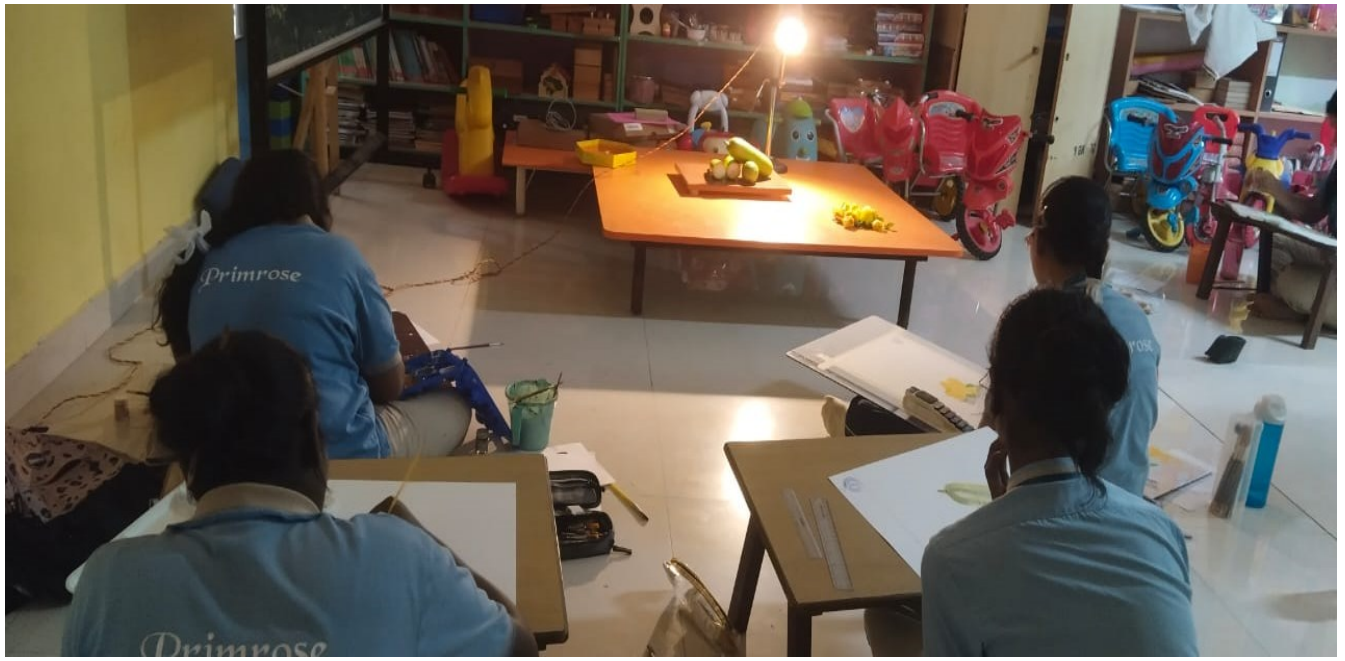
