Fun with Letter S

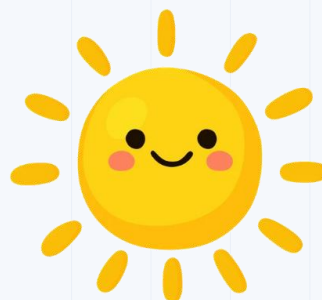

Children counted and drew five suns, helping them understand the number through drawing and counting. This activity encouraged observation, counting skills, and creativity.



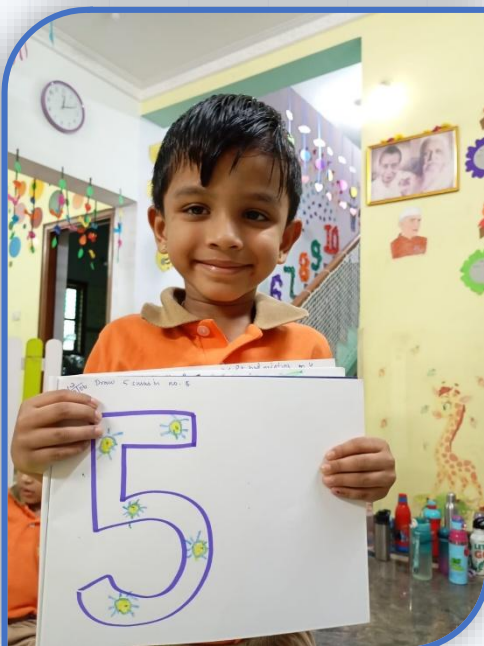

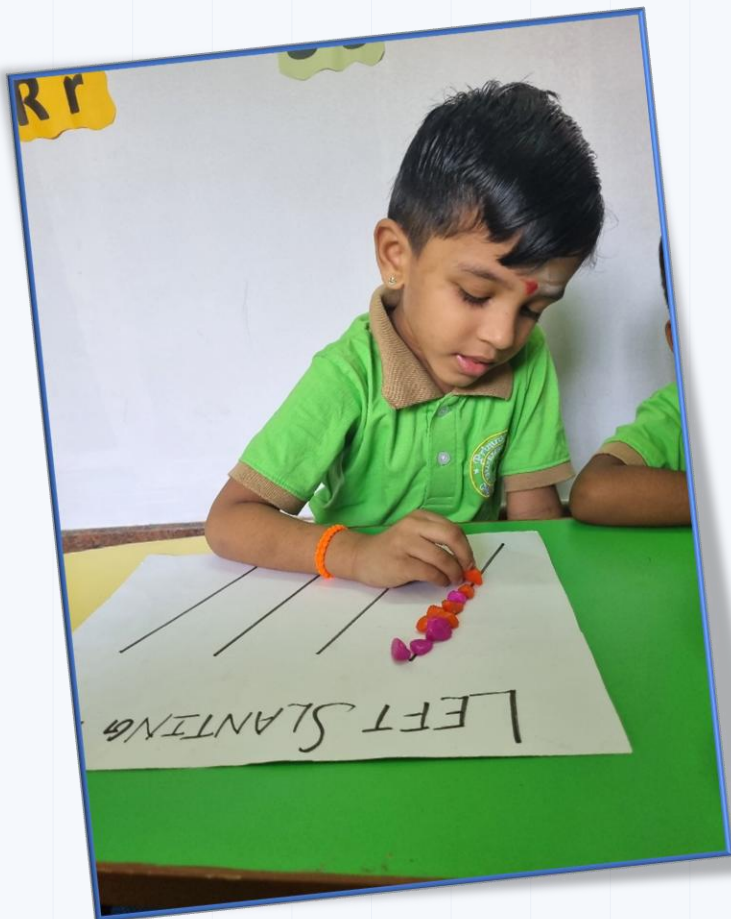

Pink Tower

Our LKG learners explored the Pink Tower by carefully arranging the cubes from the largest to the smallest. Sun Craft Activity

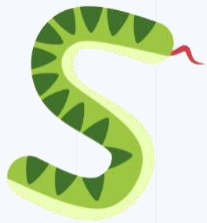

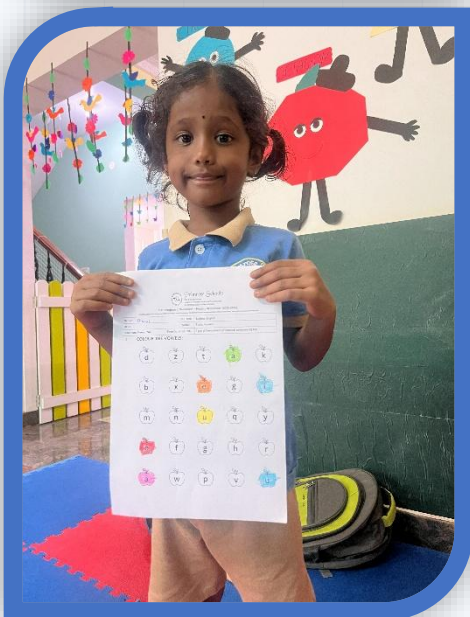

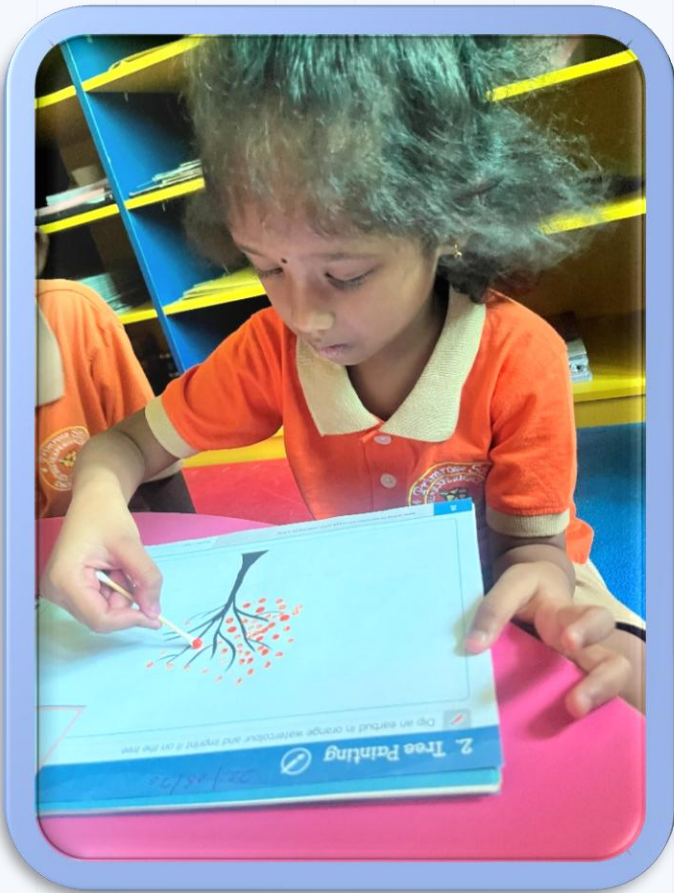

Tree Bud Painting

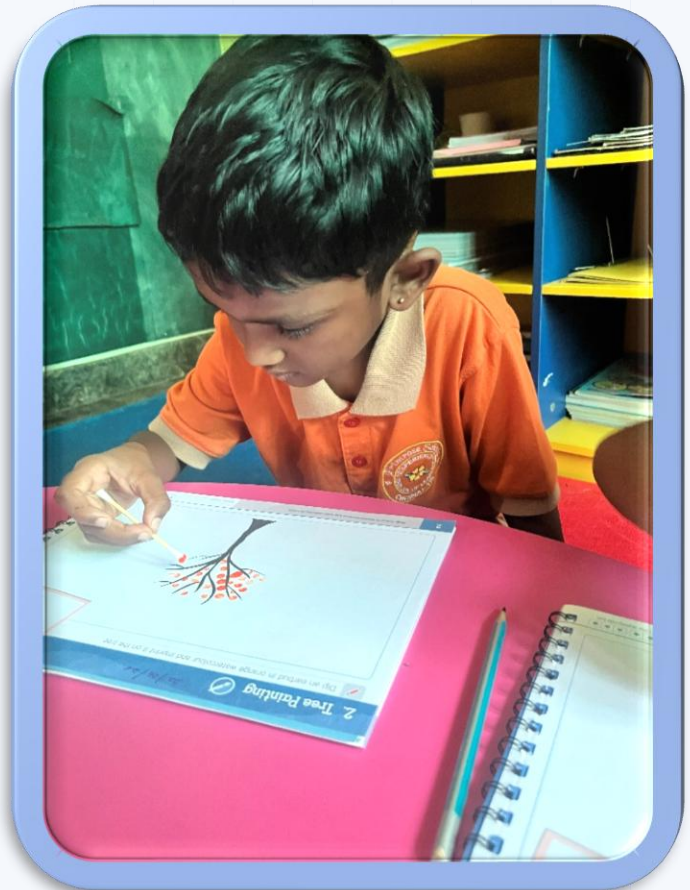
