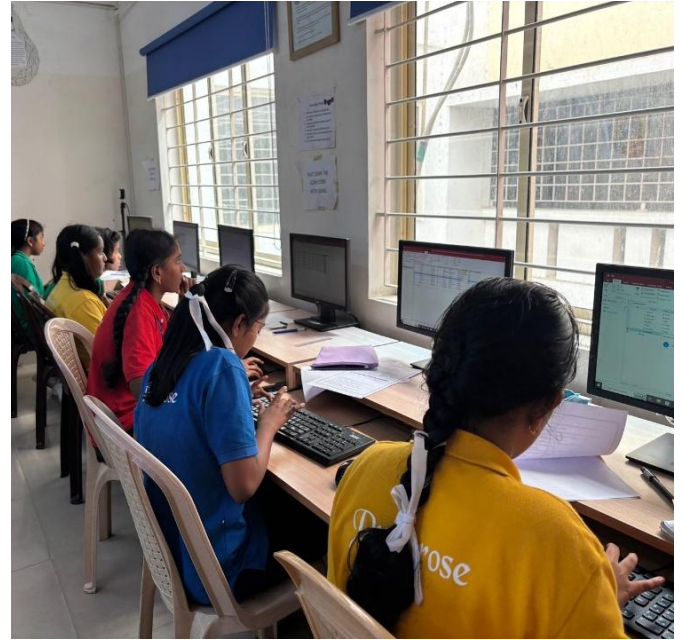


Class IX Lily Assembly

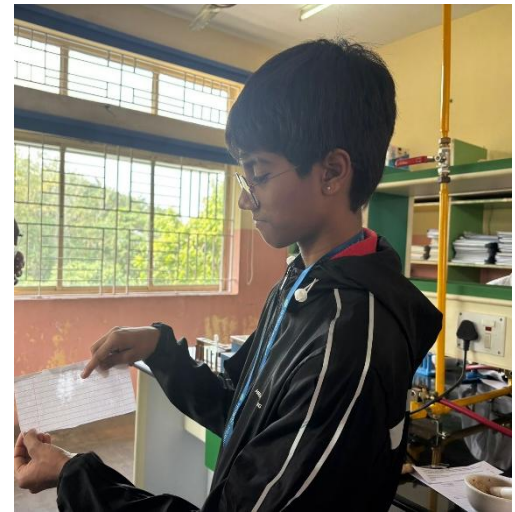
Class VIII AI Practicals

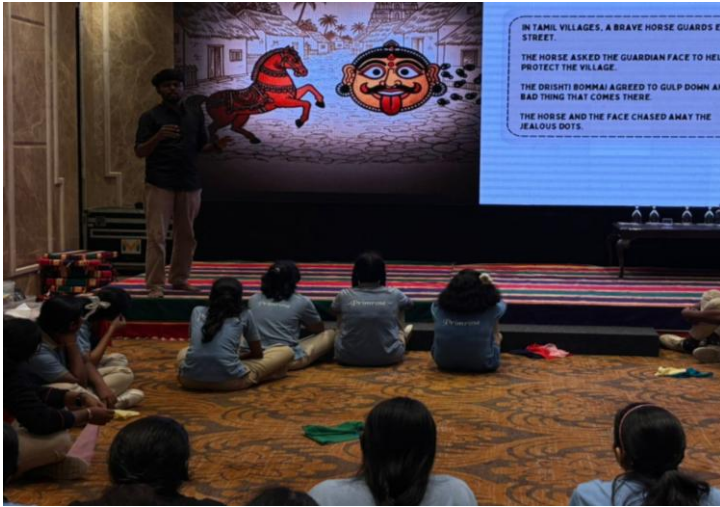
Class X SA-2 Exam
